Course Description

PodClass is a space for people all over the globe to learn about God, the Bible, and Christianity through podcasting. This series addresses common questions people have about the Bible as a book such as: "Who wrote the Bible?" "How do we interpret it?" "When did it become an actual book?" "Why do we have so many translations?" and "What can we do with all of those translations in our personal study of the Bible?"

Purpose of / Reason for the Course

Create an accessible space for people to investigate their questions about the Bible as a book and about the many different views that people have about it.

Course Objectives

- 1.) People around the globe will have access to a Bible class.
- 2.) PodClass will be a form of Christian continuing education for the listener.
- 3.) Listeners will have their faith built up (not torn down) through an academic conversation.
- 4.) Provide a variety of voices to best illuminate the subject.
- 5.) Model positive learning experiences and friendly encounters with people who have a different view than your own (it's okay to agree to disagree).
- 6.) Appreciate what a wide variety of Jesus' followers that there are in the world.
- 7.) To begin to identify what different groups of people believe and in solidarity with them or in contrast with them, what you yourself believe.
